EITI in Trinidad and Tobago at March 2016

The EITI

The Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (EITI) is a global initiative with the objective of promoting transparency and accountability by companies and governments involved in extractive industries (i.e. oil, gas and mining) by having them agree to disclosing to citizens the payments made by companies to government independently reconciled with government's declared receipts.

Countries rich in natural resources, such as oil, gas and minerals, have tended to under-perform economically, experience a higher incidence of conflict and suffer from poor governance with resultant under-development and widespread poverty. As a result, civil society organizations have campaigned for companies to publish what they pay to governments so as to foster improved governance through greater transparency and accounting to citizens and less corruption. The EITI was launched in 2003 in response to that campaign.

Of the countries that are rich in natural resources (estimated population 3.5 billion), 51 countries (population 1 billion) are members of the EITI and are at various stages of implementation. 31 countries have EITI Compliant Country status, the highest membership level, and 18 have Candidate Country status, the membership entry level. Two countries are temporarily suspended for non-compliance with the EITI Standard. Trinidad and Tobago became a member on 1 March 2011 and was accorded EITI Compliant Country status on 23 January 2015. In the Americas Region, Peru, Guatemala and Trinidad and Tobago have Compliant Country status and USA, Colombia, Honduras and Dominican Republic have Candidate Country status. Mexico and Guyana are preparing for membership. In Europe, Norway and Albania have Compliant Country status and UK and Germany have Candidate Country status. France is preparing for membership.

T&T and the EITI

Trinidad and Tobago (T&T) has played a pivotal role in the development of the EITI from its inception.

Website:

- In 2003, T&T was one of 31 countries that attended the First EITI Plenary Conference in London that established the EITI Principles (https://eiti.org/eiti/principles), the underlying tenets of the EITI that were endorsed by all EITI supporters. T&T then committed itself to participating in the EITI and was appointed to a 9-country team to undertake a 2-year Pilot Project to interpret and implement the EITI Principles. The lessons learnt from the Pilot Project shaped the development of the EITI as it is known today. The team comprised Azerbaijan, Ghana, Kyrgyz Republic, Nigeria, Peru, Republic of Congo, São Tomé and Príncipe, Timor Leste and T&T.
- In 2005, T&T attended a preparatory EITI Conference in Paris and the Second EITI Plenary Conference in London that established the EITI Criteria (https://eiti.org/eiti/criteria) based on the common, mutually agreed upon requirements for all EITI implementing countries. T&T recommitted to implementing the EITI.
- In 2006, the First EITI Global Conference was held in Oslo, Norway, and a Board of Directors was elected consisting of 20 members representing implementing countries, supporting countries, civil society organizations, extractive industries and investment companies.
- In 2007, 15 countries were assessed to have met the four Sign-up EITI criteria and were granted membership with Candidate Country status. T&T, having not progressed on three of the four Sign-up criteria, was not among the first member countries.

In 2010, September 9, the Cabinet of the Government of Trinidad and Tobago reaffirmed the country's commitment to the EITI and, on December 8, the Minister of Energy and Energy Affairs, the Honourable Carolyn Seepersad-Bachan, publicly announced Government's decision to apply for EITI membership. A Cabinet-appointed multi-stakeholder group Steering Committee (TTEITI SC) was appointed to oversee the implementation of the initiative. Cabinet mandated the Ministry of Energy and Energy Affairs (MEEA) to provide the Steering Committee with administrative and financial support.

EITI implementation highlights

Year 2011

- February 4: T&T Government applied to the EITI International Secretariat in Oslo, Norway, for EITI membership.
- March 1: T&T was admitted to EITI membership with Candidate Country status. The EITI Board set a deadline of 28 February 2013, later extended, for T&T to complete validation and gain EITI Compliant Country status.
- March 2-3: T&T was represented at 5th EITI Global Conference in Paris, France, by then Minister of Energy and Energy Affairs Carolyn Seepersad-Bachan and Victor Hart, TTEITI SC Chair. Ms. Clare Short was presented as the newly elected Chair of the EITI Board of Directors in succession to Dr. Peter Eigen.
- April 4: Minister Carolyn Seepersad-Bachan publicly launched T&T's EITI implementation programme. Dr. Peter, Eigen, immediate past-Chair of EITI Board, delivered the Feature Address.
- June 27: Senator the Honourable Kevin Ramnarine was sworn in as T&T's new Minister of Energy and Energy Affairs.

- September 15: the TTEITI Secretariat was established with Mark Regis as its Head with responsibility for general administration and the execution of the TTEITI Workplan (http://www.tteiti.org.tt/).
- September 26-27 and December 8-9: the TTEITI SC held Capacity Building Workshops to educate and inform (a) SC members, the media and other stakeholders on the EITI implementation process, (b) local accounting profession on their role in the EITI implementation and the requirements for the EITI Administrator and (c) executives of upstream energy companies on their companies' role in EITI implementation.

- May 6: T&T signed a US\$325,000.00 Grant Agreement with the World Bank Multi-Donor Trust Fund to support EITI implementation.
- June 4+5: the TTEITI SC held Capacity Building Workshops for upstream Energy Companies and staff of the MEEA.
- ❖ June 5: T&T awarded a special World Bank Grant of US\$100,000.00 for civil society capacity building and EITI awareness promotion.
- June 5: Legal Consultant contract awarded, funded by an IADB technical assistance grant, for the preparation of a Draft EITI Bill for TTEITI SC consideration.
- June 26-28: T&T was represented by a 5-person team at the first Regional EITI Conference for Latin America and the Caribbean hosted by the Government of Peru in Lima, Peru.
- August 4: the TTEITI SC held its first Civil Society Capacity Building Workshop with the aim of sensitizing Civil Society to their role in the EITI implementation process. That was followed other Civil Society workshops throughout the country.
- September 3: The TTEITI Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) was formed with the aim of popularizing the EITI among the country's youths and the recruiting of Youth Champions to spread the EITI message among their peers. There followed other youth related activities throughout the country.

Year 2013

- * February 18: BDO Trinity Limited (T&T), in partnership with Hart Nurse Group (UK), was contracted to provide the Administrator services and to produce the EITI Reports for fiscal years 2011 and 2012.
- May 1: The EITI Board introduced the 2013 EITI Standard to replace the EITI Rules 2011.

- May 23-24: T&T was represented by a 6-person team at the 6th EITI Global Conference in Sydney, Australia, which saw the adoption of the 2013 EITI Standard. TTEITI SC Chair, Victor Hart, addressed the Closing Plenary Session.
- June 7: Government, extractive companies and civil society representatives publicly signed a Stakeholders' Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on EITI implementation in T&T to affirm their commitment to the process.
- July 27-29: Mr. Jonas Moberg, Head of the EITI Secretariat in Oslo, Norway, paid his first visit to T&T to meet with stakeholders to discuss EITI implementation progress.

- ❖ August 18: Ms. Angel Yalartai of Liberia visited T&T (to 3 September) on a youth exchange programme between TTEITI and LEITI to learn about T &T Energy Sector and to share experiences with her T&T peers.
- August 28: TTEITI SC Chair, Victor Hart, attended in Medellin, Colombia, the Regional Forum on Business and Human Rights in Latin America and the Caribbean and addressed the session: UN Guiding Principles and Standards in Extractive Industries in Latin America and the Caribbean.
- September 30: T&T's first EITI Report for fiscal year 2011 published (http://www.tteiti.org.tt/eiti-reports/).
- October 17: TTEITI SC agreed to serve on the EITI Secretariat's 12-country Pilot Study on Beneficial Ownership to test the feasibility of requesting such disclosure through the EITI by oil, gas and mining companies operating in implementing countries. T&T was unable to complete the undertaking.
- November 6: TTEITI SC and University of the West Indies (UWI) signed a Memorandum of Understanding to collaborate in capacity building programmes for EITI stakeholders with emphasis on civil society.
- November 17- 22: T&T was represented by a 5-person team at the second Latin America and Caribbean (LAC) Regional EITI Conference and Workshop held in Bogotá, Colombia. Included were a 1-day Civil Society Workshop, a 2-day Conference and a 2-day Training Workshop on the 2013 EITI Standard. Head of the TTEITI Secretariat addressed the conference's Plenary Session.
- November 29: Contract awarded to International Petroleum Associates Norway (IPAN) to conduct T&T's first Validation Test.

- January 15: The TTEITI mobile application and website, designed to make T&T's EITI Reports more accessible, were released for Android, IOS and Blackberry mobile devices at http://www.tteiti.org.tt/report-data-reconciliations/
- February 5: TTEITI SC hosted T&T's first Contract Transparency workshop to introduce the concept as part of the Trinidad and Tobago Energy Conference 2014. The Feature Address was delivered by Dr. Susan Maples.
- ❖ February 12-21: IPAN AS of Norway conducted their Country Field Trip to T&T as part of the Validation Test. The Validators met with the TTEITI SC on February 20.
- February 20: Launch of 6-day CSO Training Course at University of West Indies facilitated by lecturers from UWI, Pontifical Catholic University of Peru, Revenue Watch Institute (Natural Resource Governance Institute) and TTEITI Team. The course, entitled 'Understanding the extractive industries in Latin America and the Caribbean', was attended by CSO representatives and government actors from T&T, Guyana, Suriname and Jamaica.
- March 31: Head of TTEITI Secretariat, Mark Regis, was succeeded by Ms. Melanie Richards as Interim-Head.
- April 1: The Secretariat was strengthened by the addition of Vanita Redoy (Policy Analyst) and Garik Joseph (Project Officer).
- April 10: Policy Analyst Gisela Granado left the TTEITI Secretariat to take up a position at the EITI Secretariat in Oslo, Norway.
- ❖ May 19: The Administrator began work on the EITI Report 2012 based on the 2013 EITI Standard.
- May 22: TTEITI SC endorsed the Validator's Final Report and submitted it to the EITI International Secretariat.
- ❖ June 1-7: Publish What You Pay (PWYP) team visited T&T for joint activities with UWI and TTEITI SC.
- June 5: TTEITI SC hosted a Plenary Session on 'Status of Transparency Initiatives in Trinidad and Tobago' at UWI/bpTT Revenue Reporting Conference.
- June 25: TTEITI made a presentation entitled 'EITI and the Environment. What's the connection' at the University of Trinidad and Tobago and The Cropper Foundation's event 'A Research Showcase on the Extractive Industries'.
- ❖ June 30: Melanie Richards represented TTEITI at the 29th EITI Board Meeting and associated events in Mexico City and made a presentation entitled 'The impact of the EITI on governance in the extractive industries'.

- August 8: TTEITI SC submitted its Draft EITI Bill to MEEA to initiate action for Parliament's enactment.
- September 29: T&T's second EITI Report for fiscal year 2012 published (http://www.tteiti.org.tt/eiti-reports/).
- October: The EITI Report 2012 Roadshow was launched to widely disseminate the report findings. It included electronic and print media reports and ads, TV and Radio Interviews and a public forum for the business community.
- November 4: SC Chair, Victor Hart, attended an IDB Forum at The Brookings Institution, Washington DC, at the launch of a book 'Transparent Governance in an Age of Abundance: Experiences from the Extractive Industries in Latin America and the Caribbean' to which TTEITI had contributed a chapter.
